



Obstetrical Patients Above 22 weeks Gestation with COVID-19 Infection

The care of the pregnant patient is multidisciplinary & shared care.



Obstetrician
Will see daily & PRN

CALL IF

- Decreased fetal movement
- Vaginal bleeding or fluid
- Back pain
- Contractions or abdominal pain
- Other fetal or MEWs concerns



General Internal
Medicine (GIM)
Internist on IPC
shared care
Will see daily & PRN

CALL IF

After 4 pm, page
GIM-on-call prn

- If COVID 19 test is positive
- O₂ sat on RA < 95%
- Increased O₂ to maintain >95%
- SBP above 160 or DBP above 100
- Chest pain
- Persistent high fever
- Other medical issues

A call to GIM or CCRT should always be accompanied by a simultaneous call to MRP.

If the patient is on oxygen, the CCRT will follow patients routinely.



CCRT RN
Once / shift

CCRT MD
Daily / prn

CALL IF

- Any usual CCRT calling criteria
- 3 L/min or more of oxygen to maintain O₂ saturations above 95%
- Increased work of breathing



- Threatened
- Stridor



- RR ≤ 8 or ≥ 30
- Resp distress



- SBP ≤ 90
- Lactate ≥ 4
- HR ≥ 130



- GCS < 10
- Seizures



- Serious concerns about patient

Use **contact/droplet precautions** for patients under investigation or those who have COVID-19 infection.



If patient is under 22 weeks, usual process for admission applies. If the reason for admission is obstetrical or gynecological, they are admitted to the obstetrician. If the reason for admission is medical, admit to medicine/hospitalist.
